A Year of Thanks

For Pets' Sake is extremely thankful for our members and supporters who have continued to support FPS in 2024. In the spirit of Thanksgiving, here are a few issues members helped us tackle this year.

Food prices for all of us have remained high. A very successful feral cat program means more demand for cat food, as caretakers face the financial burden of feeding hungry cats, FPS has raised the amount per bag charged to caretakers, but food expenses are still high. As more and more cats are fixed (over 6300) more and more cats need food. Still on the subject of food, with your help, FPS also assists individuals in need of help to feed their animals through the Public Food Assistance Program. Walmart donations have been reduced considerably this year. "Free" food comes only occasionally when FPS receives a call. The pet food burden has been somewhat reduced by Colorado Pet Pantry taking on local food distribution, but for many people both programs are needed to just keep their animals fed. Again, the amount charged per bag has increased, and there are limits on how much food can be obtained every three months, but costs for the food program have continued to increase

Helping all animals live happy, healthy lives is a major part of the FPS mission. For Pets' Sake has two different rescue programs. One, subsidized pets, represents animals in permanent care of FPS. These animals came from a hoarding situation or were part of a supported feral colony, one often fed daily by FPS volunteers, who could no longer safely stay in their location (think of poisoning, severe illness, fire, etc.). These animals go into long term, or subsidized care. Over the years, these animals have become older and more infirm, and require more funds to keep them in good health. This year the amount spent on these rescue animals has increased. Another For Pets' Sake rescue program is the Foster Program. These dogs and cats come to FPS usually as injured, mistreated, and/or abandoned animals. When they are healthy and old enough to be on their own, they go on to find forever homes. FPS provides the lifeline to make that happen. (See separate story in this newsletter).

For Pets' Sake is continually grateful to YOU, our supporters, who make it possible for these programs to continue, even as demand and prices increase. We are especially grateful at this time to long-time, devoted member Terry Marsden. Terry remembered For Pets' Sake with a recent bequest in her will. These funds will help FPS continue its good work in the area, without the need to do extensive fundraisers like the yard sale. We are so thankful to Terry and to all of YOU for your continued support and ongoing concern. We all need to work together to improve the lives of animals in our community. Mama Koda and Her Puppies

In 2015, FPS was contacted to collaborate on a large rescue, removing at least ten dogs and multiple cats living outside with little food, water, or shelter. It was a massive undertaking requiring hundreds of hours and multiple agencies and rescues. FPS agreed to provide food for the remaining animals once fixed, on the condition the family did not add any other animals. An FPS board member took them food every month tirelessly year after year. About 5 years ago she alerted us there were new dogs on the property. The family agreed to surrender them so that they could keep receiving food.



Unfortunately, the volunteer in charge of taking them food all these years recently passed away. A new volunteer went to the property to deliver food. It was obvious the agreement had been breached, with a number of young dogs, and at least one severely emaciated mama dog with six skinny pups. The mom and puppies were put in a loving foster home to make sure they were getting the best care and food.

Peanut

We got the pups and mom to the vet, and in addition to being very malnourished, mama Koda had anaplasmosis (tick or flea borne), and severe anemia. We got her on meds right away, and she's slowly gaining weight and getting stronger. The puppies were all relatively healthy, just underweight. The smallest of the puppies only weighed 1.1 pounds at 8 weeks. He eventually turned a corner and is finally gaining weight.



FPS is so grateful to the many people who helped give this mama and puppies a new life. This little family now has a rescue partner and they will be leaving in a couple of different groups around the 1st of November. Mama Koda still has a long way to go to reach her ideal weight but she is steadily gaining. She's proven to be a sweet social girl and she's loving her warm coat, soft bed, and living indoors for the first time. Her puppies are typical crazy, energetic, adorable puppies.
