Preventing Animal Cruelty All Year

April is officially recognized as Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Month, epitomized by the Five Freedoms of animal welfare:

- 1. Freedom from Hunger and Thirst by ready access to fresh water and diet to maintain health and vigor.
- 2. Freedom from Discomfort by providing an appropriate environment including shelter and a comfortable resting area.
- 3. Freedom from Pain, Injury or Disease by prevention of rapid diagnosis and treatment.
- 4. Freedom to Express Normal Behavior by providing sufficient space, proper facilities and company of the animal's own kind.
- 5. Freedom from Fear and Distress by ensuring conditions and treatment which avoid mental suffering.

For Pets' Sake, with YOUR support, is constantly on the alert to protect animals and help them live healthy, happy lives.

- FPS food programs assist caretakers who feed feral cat colonies and pet owners who need help to feed their pets. A small donation for the food helps cover FPS expenses. Occasionally, FPS will work with other agencies and law enforcement to rescue and relocate animals without adequate food and water to an area with adequate care.
- FPS donates free dog houses for animals in need of shelter.
- FPS, with a grant from the Animal Assistance Foundation, provides up to \$250 to aid pets with injuries, cancer and other diseases, and dental care. Financial assistance from our general fund for kitten and puppy shots gives young animals a solid footing. The FPS spay/neuter program, facilitated by a grant from the Colorado Pet Overpopulation Fund and our general fund, prevents unwanted puppies and kittens from being born and helps adult animals lead their best lives.
- FPS's foster program provides kittens, puppies, dogs, and cats the opportunity to find homes where they will prosper. A strong working relationship with statewide partners helps FPS place foster animals where they will receive proper care and attention—and often share forever homes with others of their own kind. And this year, FPS, with funding from the LOR Foundation, paired trainers and dogs to correct behavioral problems and maintain the security of dogs' forever homes.

Together, we make a difference in animals' lives every day.
