Help Max Find His Forever Home

Beautiful, smart Max is a very lucky boy. FPS snatched him up less than 24 hours from euthanasia. With no foster homes available, we placed Max in a boarding facility, where he developed a terrible case of "happy tail." He probably had it all along but was in tight quarters at the facility much of the time and really bloodied himself up. And his tail could be painful when it struck people and other animals. After consulting with several veterinarians, we concluded that the only permanent solution was a partial amputation. He developed a terrible infection that required a second surgery to remove even more of his tail. He currently lives with other dogs of all sizes and temperaments and is doing amazingly well. The term *bombproof* has been used to describe Max. He absolutely adores people and loses his mind with joy when he sees them. He's been around kids ages 5 and up and is learning to suppress his joy a little bit so that nobody gets knocked over. He's met some mellow cats and did great with them, but caution would be advised because he doesn't know his own strength. He seems content to run around with the other dogs for an hour or two per day, but mostly he loves to snuggle and sleep. He seems to alert to deer, goats, and horses, so off-leash hikes are probably not a good idea. Max seems to particularly love men. He could be a great hiking companion or even a running partner as he's learning not to pull when leash walking. The dogs are separated at feeding times because some of the other dogs get very excited, which sometimes triggers a quick correction when the dog bowls are distributed, so caution is advised.

Max is about 4 years old, approximately 75 pounds, up to date on all vaccines, heartworm negative and on preventive medication, microchipped, and neutered. He would make a wonderful companion for a couple, single person, or family. He could likely adapt to just about any situation. Please help us find Max's forever home. Maybe you??

Banjo and Biscuit Find the Good Life



FPS was contacted by a family that had purchased two purebred cocker spaniels about 5 years ago. The dogs were well cared for, beautiful and healthy, groomed, and very friendly. The family 's business took them out of state and even out of the country frequently, so these two dogs spent a lot of time at a kennel. They enjoyed their time at the kennel and were always happy to come home, but the family felt that it wasn't fair to the dogs to spend so much time away from them. Although Biscuit and Banjo weren't siblings, they were just a few weeks apart in age. They were already neutered, up to date on all vaccines, and loved everyone. FPS figured it would be easy to find a rescue partner interested in a couple of purebreds.

However, the pet overpopulation problem, in this area especially, is bad right now. All of our partners' shelters and rescues are full to overflowing. It's become increasingly difficult to help people who want to rehome their animals. After a few days with no response from rescue partners, FPS put them on Petfinder. Their owners were anxious to move them. A local man with two dogs saw their profiles, so we arranged a meeting, and it was an instant match. The dogs loved Bob, Bob loved them, and his two cockers, Stewart and Beckett, got along perfectly with Biscuit and Banjo. We followed up with Bob a few times, and he tells us everyone is doing well. And BONUS . . . the bonded pair did not have to be separated to find a great home. That rarely happens. We are so grateful to Bob and all of our supporters who helped us create happy beginnings like this.
